5.3 Grade 5 Farewell

- June 18th @ Sacred Heart @ 10:00 a.m.
- Online parent meeting will be held on March 27 from 7 8 pm. Lisa Mackey is heading up this committee.
- A rough summary is included of the events for that day:
 - **-Work Bee a week before graduation:** Parents will meet at the school one day from 3:30 5:30 to print off and frame the "Best of Student" framed comments from their classmates as well as any new content needed for the Amazing Race portion as well as their certificates for finishing the race.
 - -Mass 10:30 11:30 and ceremony after in church: Teachers prepare a slideshow and hand out certificates and the "Best of Student" frames. Parent volunteers print and frame the 'Best of Student' gift for the teachers to distribute.
 - **-Lunch after mass:** Boston Pizza will be contacted to deliver personalized pizzas and a cookie for each student. A google form will be created for student orders. - Will ask for parent volunteers to come to cook/help with food.


5.5 Gaga Ball Pit Update

6.0 New Business



6.1 Climbing Wall in Gym

Our Climbing Wall was installed and the students are loving it! It was a huge surprise for the students! We started by posting mysterious posters around the school with words like "Can you rise to the challenge?", or "Get ready to go UP! "Something BIG is coming to our school... Something HIGH... Something that will challenge you to reach new heights! Keep your eyes open for more clues!"

Our next step was to have each class participate in a Treasure Hunt: "Rise to the Challenge: A Secret Awaits!

Then all students were invited to a school assembly with the BIG REVEAL of the Climbing Wall. Whoever found the first clue in the morning Treasure Hunt was also awarded a Golden Ticket and got to be among the FIRST to climb the wall! A live feed of the BIG REVEAL was shared on social media.

- We are wondering if the School Council would commit \$700 to pay for the final addition to the wall.
- One of the panels that were supposed to come was damaged. The company sent a new panel and new hand holds.
- Company is going to pay for correction of realignment of the holes for the line indicating how far kids can climb up the wall.
- To get another 3' blue mat and shipping is going to cost \$619.62.
- Tony motioned to accept this to allot this to cover the cost (\$619.62) of the additional mat and shipping. Jennica seconded the motion. Passed.

6.2 Addition of School Activity Fee or School Council Fee

- <u>School Activity Fees</u>: fee would cover field trips for all grade levels.
 (admissions, busing, any other costs) This would be a school fee, and it would be up to the school to decide how the funds are spent. School Council can still have input in the decision.
- School Council Fee: fee would likely be initiated in lieu of fundraising initiated by School Council (either partially, or totally eliminating School Council fundraising.) The School Council would determine how the funds are spent (along with the principal's approval). The funds could be used for field trips, but could also be used for school purchases, such as a special activity/craft for Mother's Day/Father's Day.

- We reviewed what schools do a School Activity Fee or a School Council Feee within RDCRS.
- Discussed pros and cons of these fees implemented at the beginning of the vear.
- School Council has decided to table this and reassess next year and see how the fundraising goes. We will keep fundraising as status quo for next year.

6.3 Joint School Council Meeting with Trustees (Information Item)

- February 26th, 2025 6:00 7:30 @ Montfort Centre
- The Board of Trustees invites all staff, parents, and community members to participate in upcoming Stakeholder Engagement Sessions next month. These sessions will focus on gathering feedback to inform the 2025-2026 school division budget. Key themes for discussion, identified in November 2024, include mental health support, special needs resources, staffing concerns, transportation costs, and holistic student well-being. Sessions will be held online on April 15th and in person at St. Thomas Aquinas Middle School on April 16th, both from 6:30 PM to 8:00 PM.
- Participants will be asked to consider the impact of recent provincial budget announcements and discuss how to prioritize resources for quality faith-based education and student needs. They will also explore innovative community-driven solutions to support student success amid potential resource constraints. The Board values this input to guide budgetary priorities and ensure the best possible learning environment for all students.
